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DAY 01. OCTOBER 10, 2025 –

Departure from your countries of origin on transcontinental flights. Meals will be served during your time on board the flight. Overnight on board.

DAY 02. OCTOBER 11, 2025 – LISBON

Arrival at Lisbon International Airport. Immigration process and baggage claim. Meeting with our representative, who will guide us to our bus. WELCOME TO PORTUGAL! At around 9 a.m., we begin our Lisbon city tour, heading to the oceanside Belem Tower to enter and explore this historic site. Then, we will head to the Jeronimos Monastery. We will have a brief explanation outside, take photos, and then go inside to visit the iconic Monastery. Free time for lunch and to try a dessert at the most famous pastry shop in all of Portugal: Pasteis de Belem. Then, we will begin a panoramic tour of Lisbon, one of the most beautiful cities in Europe. We will see the City's most important and iconic places and monuments, then go up to the Eduardo VII Park viewpoint for photos, visit the famous Praça do Comércio, where we will walk through the giant arch leading to Rua Augusta, visit the Cathedral, and explore the capital's streets. We'll also enjoy a 45-minute boat tour, enjoying wonderful views from the Tagus River until reaching the Belém Tower. Transfer to the hotel for check-in. Dinner and free time for those who wish to return to the Historic Center on their own to experience its nightlife. Overnight in Lisbon.

DAY 03. OCTOBER 12, 2025 - LISBON - SANTAREM - FATIMA

Breakfast. After enjoying breakfast at the hotel, we will board our bus to say goodbye to Lisbon. To start our day, we will head to Santarem, one of Portugal's main cities, linked to the beginning of the Christian era during the city's conquest by the King of Portugal, when it was occupied by the Moors. In this city, we will visit the Church of the Holy Miracle, which houses one of the oldest eucharistic miracles in the world. In this beautiful church, we will have the opportunity to adore the Host in person. An unforgettable moment. Celebration of Holy Mass. Free time for lunch. In the afternoon, we will leave Santarem toward one of the most beautiful destinations of a Marian pilgrimage....get ready to arrive in Fátima. Upon arriving in Fatima, we will check in at the hotel and have free time to walk along Fatima's main street to explore the town and religious souvenir shops. Around 6 p.m., we will have dinner and prepare to participate in the evening celebrations at the Sanctuary of Fatima. We will take part in the recitation of the Holy Rosary at the Sanctuary's esplanade, attend Holy Mass, and also experience one of the most symbolic moments at the Sanctuary: the Candlelight Procession. Overnight in Fátima.

DAY 04. OCTOBER 13, 2025 - FATIMA - ALJUSTREL - FATIMA

Breakfast. After enjoying breakfast at the hotel, we begin our pilgrimage day with the Sanctuary's massive celebration of the October 13, 1917 Miracle of the Sun. Now, we will head to Aljustrel, where we will walk, pray, and contemplate the Stations of the Way of the Cross, as well as visit the exact site of one of the apparitions of our Heavenly Mother. Then, we will continue walking to visit the houses where the little shepherds lived, the children to whom the Virgin Mary appeared in 1917. Free time for lunch. In the afternoon, we will return to the





Sanctuary of Our Lady of Fatima. We will visit the Chapel of the Apparitions, the exact place where the Virgin Mary appeared. We will enter the New Basilica and the Old Basilica. Free time for prayer and to perform the candle rite (throwing candles into the burning fire as a sign of offering our petitions to the Virgin Mary). Celebration of Holy Mass. For those who wish, we may do the kneeling procession from the top of the esplanade or inside the Chapel of the Apparitions. Dinner at the hotel. At night, we will participate in the celebrations held at the Sanctuary, including the Mass of Nations, the recitation of the Holy Rosary, and the most important event at the Sanctuary: the impressive Candlelight Procession with 300,000 fellow Catholics from all over the world. Get ready for a very spiritual night. Overnight in Fátima.

DAY 05. OCTOBER 14, 2025 – FÁTIMA – CORIA – ÁVILA

Breakfast. After enjoying breakfast at the hotel, we will board our bus to say good-bye to Portugal. Get ready because we are about to change countries. Now, we head toward Coria. WELCOME TO SPAIN. Once in Spanish territory, we will arrive in Coria. The City of Coria houses one of the most important relics of Christianity: the tablecloth used during Christ's Last Supper before His Passion, the origin of the Church and the institution of Holy Mass. Celebration of Holy Mass. Free time for lunch. We will board our bus again to head to Avila, the city of kings and saints, and the birthplace of Saint Teresa. Arrival in Avila. Dinner and overnight in Avila.

DAY 06. OCTOBER 15, 2025 - AVILA — ALBA DE TORMES — SALAMANCA - AVILA

Breakfast. After enjoying breakfast at the hotel, we will board our bus to head to the town of Alba de Tormes. This town is home to the Carmelite Monastery that Saint Teresa founded in 1571. Upon arrival in Alba de Tormes, we celebrate Mass at the Monastery where she died and was buried. After Mass, you will have the opportunity to visit the museum dedicated to Saint Teresa of Avila, which also preserves her incorrupt heart and left arm. Enjoy free time for lunch before continuing to Salamanca. Salamanca is a city in the Castilla y León region known for its great university, the oldest in Spain still in operation, and its remarkable culture.

Our walking tour will take us to the most notable sites, such as the majestic Plaza Mayor, an iconic square filled with restaurants and shops. La Clerecia, a church and school of the Jesuit Order built in the 17th century. The House of Shells, now a public library and monument decorated with shells symbolizing the famous Camino de Santiago. The University of Salamanca, the oldest in Spain and the third oldest in Europe. The Roman Bridge, a national monument stretching over the Tormes River and one of Salamanca's most robust bridges. The Church of San Marcos, built in Romanesque style, contains impressive paintings depicting scenes from Our Lady's life. The Church of San Martin, dedicated to Saint Martin of Tours, patron of beggars and the needy. You will visit the interiors of Salamanca's two cathedrals (old and new), one in Romanesque and the other in Gothic style. Celebration of Holy Mass. After this full day of activities, you will return to your hotel in Avila to enjoy a delicious dinner and spend the night.





DAY 07. OCTOBER 16, 2025 - AVILA

Breakfast. After enjoying breakfast at the hotel, we will board our bus to continue our pilgrimage through Ávila. We begin with the walled city of Avila, home to Saint Teresa, one of the four female Doctors of the Church. The preservation of its architecture, with convents and churches, makes this city an essential stop on any Catholic pilgrimage. The Cathedral of Avila features Romanesque, Gothic, and Renaissance styles, reflected in its art and architecture. The Basilica of Saint Vincent in Ávila stands on the site of Saint Vincent's martyrdom. We will visit the Convent of the Incarnation, where Saint Teresa took her vows. Saint Teresa convinced Saint John of the Cross to reform the male Carmelite order, a reform she began after meeting Saint John in Medina del Campo. Celebration of Holy Mass. Dinner and overnight in Avila.

DAY 08. OCTOBER 17, 2025 - AVILA - TOLEDO - MADRID

Breakfast. After enjoying breakfast at the hotel, we will board our bus and head to our next pilgrimage destination: Toledo, located on a rocky promontory surrounded on three sides by a deep gorge of the Tagus River, making it a unique city. Every available inch of this rock hosts churches, synagogues, mosques, and houses stacked in a disorderly spiral, intersected by narrow cobbled streets winding their way through. Interestingly, for centuries, Christians, Muslims, and Jews lived here in relative equality and peace. Celebration of Holy Mass. Free time for lunch.

The walled city hides great treasures: its beautiful Church of Santo Tome, the Synagogue of El Transito, the Synagogue of Santa Maria la Blanca, the Church of San Juan de los Reyes, the Puerta de Bisagras, the Puerta del Cambron, the Puerta del Sol, among others. After our tour of Toledo, we will board our bus to head to Spain's capital: Madrid. Dinner and overnight in Madrid.

DAY 09. OCTOBER 18, 2025 - MADRID - SEGOVIA - MADRID

Breakfast. After enjoying breakfast at the hotel, we will board our bus to enjoy a day trip to Segovia, a Castilian city with 2000 years of history and where Saint Teresa founded her ninth Order. This city is enriched by enormous spiritual qualities of undeniable value. Here, Saint John of the Cross, a friend of Saint Teresa, theological scholar, and one of the greatest poets of the Spanish language, is buried in a convent. The bodily remains of Saint Dominic, founder of the Dominican Order, to whom the Catholic Church historically attributes the creation of the Holy Rosary, are buried in a monastery on the city's outskirts. Celebration of Holy Mass. Free time for lunch.

We will also visit the Alcazar, a royal palace built in the 11th century where Queen Isabella agreed to finance Christopher Columbus' expedition. Later, we will pass through Segovia's Old Town, where you will see the Roman Aqueduct and the Cathedral. After our tour in Segovia, we will board our bus again to return to Madrid. Dinner and overnight in Madrid.

DAY 10. OCTOBER 19, 2025 - MADRID

Breakfast at the hotel. After enjoying breakfast, we will board our bus again to start our city tour of Madrid. We begin with a panoramic view of Madrid, passing by the





most important historical sites in this beautiful city. We will admire the impressive Cibeles, the meeting point for national celebrations as well as social and sports events. We will continue to the Prado Museum before arriving at the world-famous Puerta de Alcala. Get your phones ready because we will have a few minutes to step out and take pictures with the Puerta de Alcala. Then, we will enjoy a walking tour of another of Madrid's icons: El Retiro Park. Get ready to listen and learn about its fascinating history. Free time for lunch.

In the afternoon, we continue our tour, arriving at the heart of Spain's capital and also the heart of the entire country. We have arrived at the Royal Palace and Plaza Mayor. We will enjoy a walking tour from the Puerta del Sol to the iconic Gran Vía, followed by free time to stroll at your own pace through the streets. We will have the chance to stop for photos at the world-famous restaurant "Sobrino de Botín," which holds the title of the oldest restaurant in Spain and one of the 10 oldest in the world. After our tour, we will board our bus again to return to our hotel. Dinner and overnight in Madrid.

DAY 11. OCTOBER 20, 2025 - MADRID - ZARAGOZA

Breakfast. After enjoying breakfast at the hotel (or taking our boxed lunch), we will leave very early for the Madrid train station to take the bullet train around 7 a.m. to Zaragoza. Upon arrival in Zaragoza, around 9 a.m., we will begin our tour by heading to the emblematic and beautiful Basilica of El Pilar, the first Marian Shrine in history. Guided tour and explanation at the Basilica of El Pilar. Celebration of Holy Mass. Free time for prayer at the Sanctuary. Free time for lunch.

Afterward, we will tour the beautiful city of Zaragoza, where we will see monuments such as the Aljaferia Palace, a World Heritage Site reflecting the splendor of the Muslim kings who lived there. We will visit the city center. After finishing, we will board our bus to head to our hotel for check-in. Dinner and overnight in Zaragoza.

DAY 12. OCTOBER 21, 2025 – ZARAGOZA – BARCELONA

Breakfast. After enjoying breakfast at the hotel, we will board our bus early to head to the last stop of our pilgrimage: Barcelona. Upon arrival in Barcelona, we will make our first stop at one of the most spectacular and impactful monasteries in Europe. We are referring to the Monastery of Our Lady of Montserrat, home to the image of the Virgin of Montserrat, popularly known worldwide as "La Moreneta," in a unique natural setting. Guided tour. Celebration of Holy Mass. Free time for lunch.

In the afternoon, we will visit one of Barcelona's most iconic sites: the Sagrada Familia, the masterpiece Basilica of Blessed Antoni Gaudí. Guided tour of the Sagrada Familia. Afterward, we will board our bus to head to the hotel for check-in. Dinner and overnight in Barcelona.

DAY 13. OCTOBER 22, 2025 - BARCELONA

Breakfast. After enjoying breakfast at the hotel, we will board our bus again to start the Half-Day City Tour of Barcelona. We will take a panoramic tour of the most





famously beautiful sights such as the Diagonal, Plaza Colón, the Olympic Port, and Montjuïc, among others. We will also stroll through the city's old quarter, known as the Gothic Quarter. During the day, we will walk along the internationally famous Ramblas or the Boqueria Market, among other highlights of the historic-artisticcenter. Free time for lunch and to continue exploring Barcelona at your own pace. At night, or at the indicated time, we will board our bus to head to Barcelona International Airport to board our flights back to our home countries.

DAY 14. OCTOBER 23, 2025 –

On this day, you will be flying back to your home countries. Meals will be served on board. Wishing you a very good trip. May God bless you richly!
